INTRODUCTION

Welcome to our 2010 brochure for trips from Borehamwood, Potters Bar, Barnet and Finchley areas. Following a successful four years of excursions we now expect to provide two buses on most of our summer trips avoiding delays and, for some, the need to change buses at South Mimms. This will also help ensure our buses run on time through Potters Bar. We have slightly reduced the number of excursions this year, but this is to enable us to provide you with a better quality product.

This year's brochure includes a few new destinations as well as many of your favourites. We would like to highlight three particularly special trips this year. The first is the St George's Day event at Wrest Park Gardens on April 25th. This is one of England's greatest gardens. Whether you prefer a fun filled family event or the peace of some beautiful gardens this is the trip for you. On May 16th we will be taking what will probably sadly be our last visit to Leonardslee Gardens. The new owners are closing the gardens to the public in June and our visit this year is timed to see this grade 1 listed garden in all its splendour. Finally, for our trip to the War and Peace Show on Saturday 24 July, World War 2 veterans will be able to gain free entry provided they apply in advance. Please contact us by the end of June and we will supply the necessary forms.

None of our trips in this brochure require advance booking. You pay the driver on the day. Please note that a number of trips pick up 30 minutes earlier than the standard times. This is to help ensure our passengers get maximum enjoyment out of the day at top locations such as Portsmouth, Eastbourne and Brighton. Our longer trips all feature a comfort break on both the outward and return journeys. Most of our buses are wheelchair accessible, but please ring to book your wheelchair on board as space is limited. Dogs, apart from guide dogs, are not allowed on our trips.

**Please note that on Sunday March 14th (Dobbies Garden Centre and Towcester National Hunt racing) the morning pick-ups will be 30 mins later. A number of other trips run 30 minutes earlier than the above times. Please remember that all trips pick up at all stops on each route. Please note that depending on numbers, passengers on pick up route 2 from the Barnet area may be asked at South Mimms to transfer to the bus from pick up route 1 which will then proceed to cover pick up route 3. Comfort stops are provided on longer journeys and on request on other journeys where possible.

2010 HIGHLIGHTS

The information below is given to the best of our knowledge. If a journey arrives significantly later because of traffic etc our driver will notify you of any revised departure times. But please remember that driving hour regulations means that we, in line with all bus and coach companies, have limited flexibility to change planned schedules.

SUNDAY 14 MARCH: MOTHERS DAY SPECIAL: DOBBIES GARDEN CENTRE & TOWCESTER HORSE RACES – FREE ADMISSION (morning pick ups 30 MINUTES later than standard times)

On this trip we are picking up 30 minutes later than normal. After a stop for lunch at **Dobbies Garden Centre** where you will “discover a world of inspiration for your garden and home” and perhaps buy some plants or a gift for someone special we travel the short distance to **Towcester Racecourse** where we will enjoy an afternoon’s horse racing. Never been racing before? This is a great opportunity to have a fun day out and with our simple betting guide it will all be very clear. The best of all admission is free (this is unique in Britain) so apart from refreshments and a few bets (they start from £1) you won’t need to spend very much!! .

SUNDAY 28 MARCH: SOUTHEND

Seven miles of seafront; good shopping; the world’s longest pier with its trains; rides at Adventure Island; the Sea-life centre; the Kursaal entertainment centre; all the usual seaside amusements plus museums; art galleries and even a casino make Southend a great day out

EASTER SUNDAY 4 APRIL: CONSTABLE COUNTRY

We will visit some of the places associated with England’s most famous landscape painter and his paintings such as Flatford Mill and Dedham as well see some of the beauty of the Essex and Suffolk countryside.

EASTER SUNDAY 4 APRIL: COLCHESTER ZOO AT EASTER –AS SEEN ON TV!!

The Zoo is one of the best in Europe. It has elephants, chimpanzees, orang-utans, lemurs, penguins, lions, tigers, giant anteaters, sealions, komodo dragons and many more including lesser known ones such as fossa and binturongs. There’s always plenty going on at Easter at Colchester Zoo with the chance to walk through the truly enchanting Easter Wonderland, follow an Easter trail around the zoo and see all the adorable Spring babies, including the chance for children to see Easter chicks as they hatch in their incubators at Familiar Friends as well as meet the Easter Bunny. Sullivan Bus passengers will get a significant saving on admission of up to £6. Our driver will collect your admission fees on the day: -. Adults £10.99, Senior Citizens £7.99. Children £6.99.

SATURDAY 10 APRIL: WAKEHURST PLACE GARDENS –Half price admission!!

Managed by Kew and with over 180 acres of gardens, woodland and nature reserves to enjoy, a visit to Wakehurst is a must for garden enthusiasts and nature lovers alike. See the ornamental gardens set around the Elizabethan mansion; and also the Millenium Seed bank. Normal admission price £10 BUT admission for Sullivan Buses passengers just £5! NT members and children under 17 free.

SUNDAY 25 APRIL: ST GEORGES DAY FESTIVAL AT WREST PARK GARDENS

This is one of the most magnificent gardens in England, yet one of the least well known. Wrest Park’s formal gardens provide a fascinating history of gardening styles, laid out over 150 years and inspired by the great gardens of Versailles in France. **But today** Wrest Park is also packed full of activities for the whole family, and culminates in a re-enactment of St George’s fight with the dragon. The weekend includes displays of medieval falconry, a knight’s tournament with jousting, a replica Roman encampment, three arenas of period entertainment, a historic market for the grown-ups and a bouncy castle for the kids. Admission is expected to be approximately £12 for adults; £10 for seniors and £6 for children for this all day and fantastic event.

SUNDAY 2ND MAY : FELIXSTOWE AND THE VINTAGE VEHICLE RALLY

Felixstowe is an attractive Victorian town known as the “Sun Spot of the East Coast”. It possesses extensive and beautiful gardens, along its long level promenade and in the town centre. There are plenty of restaurants and cafes along the seafront and in the town centre, which has a good range

of shops. Today Felixstowe is the end of the vintage vehicle run from Ipswich where vehicles of all types from lorries and buses to cars and motorbikes will congregate on the sea front.

WEDNESDAY 5 MAY (FROM BOREHAMWOOD AND POTTERS BAR) or THURSDAY 6TH MAY (FROM FINCHLEY, BARNET AND POTTERS BAR):: CHILTERN HILL BLUEBELLS TOUR

Mother nature allowing you will be taken on a tour of one of the best sites in England for viewing bluebells. We will be showing you a range of different points of interest as we travel through some of the beautiful scenery of the Chilterns. There will be several stops where lunch and refreshments will be available.. In the afternoon we will continue our tour but stopping for afternoon tea, In the event of inclement weather we will still view the bluebells but our main stops will be at locations which are largely inside. Admission is free to all the places of interest with the exception of an optional visit to an attraction that has a small admission charge.

SUNDAY 16 MAY: LEONARDSLEE GARDENS - A FINAL VISIT?

New owners takeover these gardens shortly and they will no longer be open to the public. For the last time come and discover some of the most stunning rhododendrons and azaleas in the world. Admire the details of the amazing miniature land "Beyond the Doll's House".. There are seven lakes in this 200-acre Valley. Wildfowl, Wallabies and Deer; Victorian Motor Cars; Sculpture Garden; Plants for Sale and Gift Shop all add to a great day out for all ages **Reduced price admission is £8 for adults and £3.50 for children.**

SUNDAY 30 MAY: SOUTHEND & THE FESTIVAL OF THE AIR

The free afternoon air show can be viewed easily from the promenade and the cliff tops. But you can also enjoy all the many other attractions. Seven miles of seafront; good shopping; the world's longest pier with its trains; rides at Adventure Island; the Sea-life centre; the Kursaal entertainment centre; all the usual seaside amusements plus museums; art galleries and even a casino make Southend a great day out. The fascinating Pier museum (admission £1) will also be open for its summer season.

SUNDAY 6 JUNE: CLACTON; WALTON OR FRINTON

Clacton has fantastic sandy beaches, a lively pier (including rides, aquarium and many amusements); miles of promenade; beautiful seafront gardens and a good range of shops; cafes and amusements in the adjoining town centre. You can even take the dotto train to Holland on Sea. Why not walk one way and ride the other?

Walton is smaller than Clacton but also has lovely sandy beaches and the second longest pier in Britain, which has rides and amusements. There is a range of shops and there are plenty of places to eat and drink, including the highly popular pie and mash shop. If you are feeling energetic you can enjoy the pleasant walk along the seafront to the greenery of the Naze itself where refreshments await and perhaps climb the tower for splendid views. Buses also run between the Naze and Walton centre so you can walk one way and ride the other.

We will also stop and pick up at **Frinton (Gates)** for anyone who wishes to visit this quiet town and resort.

SUNDAY 20 JUNE: MARGATE (THE BIG EVENT-AIR DISPLAY) or BROADSTAIRS (DICKENS)

Margate needs little introduction. A traditional seaside with fine Blue Flag sandy beaches and amusements. Famous for its donkeys! Why not visit the Harbour area; the Museum and the famous Shell Grotto? Today Margate's Big Event sees a fantastic air display and lots of land based entertainment for the whole family, **Broadstairs** is very much associated with Charles Dickens and our visit coincides with the annual Dickensian Festival with a broad range of entertainment. Broadstairs has plenty to occupy the day tripper with museums, art galleries and a wide range of places to eat and drink.

SUNDAY 4 JULY: SOUTHWOLD

Southwold is a charming north Suffolk seaside town on the Suffolk Heritage Coast. Almost an island, being bounded by the North Sea to the East, by the River Blyth and Southwold harbour to the South-West and by Buss Creek to the North, there is just the one road in to and out of Southwold. The town offers much of interest, but it is the sea and Southwold's links with it that make this a wonderful destination. With its working lighthouse, beach huts, award-winning pier, busy harbour, cliff top cannon and of course the beach, Southwold is a quintessentially English resort town.

SUNDAY 18 JULY: EASTBOURNE (Morning pick ups 30 minutes earlier)

Eastbourne is one of England's largest seaside resorts. Beautiful gardens, a pier, rides, activities, children's theme parks: mini and crazy golf a Napoleonic Fortress housing a military museum:

leisure pool; a harbour and marina; water sports; boat trips; bandstand are just a few of the seaside attractions. You will also find excellent shopping; more museums (inc the "how we lived then" museum of shops) and the heritage centre in the town centre together with hundreds of places to eat and drink.

SATURDAY 24 JULY: THE WAR AND PEACE SHOW AT THE HOP FARM

The Hop Farm has entertainment for all the family. The Victorian oast houses, the largest collection in the world provide attractions and exhibits, including the story of hop picking. You can also visit the Hop Garden. There is a "Legends in Wax" exhibition, Children's Driving School, the Great Goblin 3D hunt, the Magic Factory and the Victorian Carousel plus of course the old favourites such as the famous shire horses, other animals and children's play areas.

The War and Peace Show is Britain's largest military show but it is much more than that. There is so much more to see! There are thousands of military vehicles; exciting tank and battle displays all day long; encampments representing the military throughout the twentieth century. Also there are hundreds of stalls selling anything to do with the military. Our passengers can once again also enjoy live singing; military style bands; 1940sfashion shows and talks; dancing demonstrations; a funfair, tanks; armoured car and helicopter rides and much more.

Great savings!! Sullivan Buses passengers admission to both the Hop Farm and War and Peace show is ONLY £ 10.00 Adults & £9.50 (all concessions, including seniors; carers and children(3-15)) If you travelled in a car the cost of admission would be £18 and £16 respectively!!

Special notice for World War II Veterans You can obtain free admission to the show by booking in advance. However, this must be done by early July. We will have the relevant forms available on any of our trips up to the Southwold trip. If you show your free pass to our driver on the day you will be able to travel to the War and Peace show for the child price of just £8.

SUNDAY 1 AUGUST: PORTSMOUTH (NAVY DAY) OR SOUTHSEA (Morning pick ups 30 minutes earlier)

Today is Navy Day at the Historic Dockyard at Portsmouth with navy warships and exciting displays. But there are many other attractions in the area . The Spinnaker Tower, Southsea Castle; many fascinating museums; excellent shopping in both Portsmouth and Southsea; Blue Reef Aquarium; rides and amusements; trips around Portsmouth Harbour; or to the Isle of Wight or to the attractions of Gosport; two piers; model village; historic buildings and beautiful gardens are just some of the things to see and do. We will provide you with a list of the attractions plus our special voucher book which will give a range of discounts at many of the area's attractions. Please note that the morning pick ups are 30 minutes earlier to help you make the most of this great day out.

SUNDAY 8 AUGUST: SOUTHEND

Seven miles of seafront; good shopping; the world's longest pier with its trains; rides at Adventure Island; the Sea-life centre; the Kursaal entertainment centre; all the usual seaside amusements plus museums; art galleries and even a casino make Southend a great day out. The fascinating Pier museum (admission £1) will also be open.

WEDNESDAY 11 AUGUST: CANTERBURY (market day) or HOWLETTS ZOO (from the BBC's ROAR!)

Canterbury is one of the best locations for a day trip. Do not be fooled by other companies who only allow you part of the day here – it isn't enough!! Although it is quite compact, it has everything including the new shopping complex or more traditional and specialist shops within the city walls; the famous cathedral; market; boat trips; parks and gardens and many museums and historic buildings, including the world heritage site of St Augustine's Abbey.

With a successful breeding programme **Howletts Zoo** is the envy of many other zoos, you can expect to see the largest group of elephants and gorillas in the country; tigers, lions, rhinos, monkeys, anteaters, honey badger, tapirs, hunting dogs, hyenas; rare cats and more. Don't miss the walk-through lemur enclosure. On previous visits our passengers watched several baby gorillas playing. Discounted admission for Sullivan Bus passengers is Adults £13.45; Concessions £12.45; Child(2-16) £10.45. **This means you will receive around 20% off the normal price** helping to ensure an excellent value day out!

SUNDAY 15 AUGUST: HASTINGS or RYE

Hastings is deservedly an increasingly popular day out. It has an excellent range of attractions, the castle which contains the 1066 Story; the Blue Aquarium; Smugglers Adventure; two cliff railways; the Old Town with a varied and fascinating mix of shops; historic buildings and eating and drinking places; the historic Fishermen's huts at the Stade and the largest land based fishing fleet in the country; not to mention a good beach; walks along the seafront or clifftops –the view is wonderful; beautiful parks and gardens; good shopping; a range of seaside attractions and plenty of places to eat. Why not try some locally caught fish and chips?

Alternatively visit the ancient town of **Rye**. Perched on a hill overlooking Romney Marsh it was once a port until the sea retreated. Now famous for its lovely old houses and quaint streets, Rye offers a relaxing day out. Attractions include the castle; museum and a replica model of the town at the Visitor centre. There is a range of gift and antique shops; boutiques and a good and varied selection of places to eat and drink.

WEDNESDAY 18 AUGUST: BURY ST EDMUNDS (MARKET DAY)

Bury has the largest street market in East Anglia plus excellent shopping following the opening of the large new shopping centre to add to the many smaller and specialist shops. But there is so much more. The magnificent cathedral with its new Gothic tower, the beautiful and award winning Abbey Gardens; the Greene King brewery and visitor centre (tours available at 14.00 –please ring 012847 14297 to book); the Nutshell – England's smallest pub; the recently restored Georgian Theatre Royal; Moyse's Hall one of the oldest houses in England plus several other historic buildings.

THURSDAY 26 AUGUST: CLACTON AIR SHOW or WALTON-ON-THE-NAZE or FRINTON

All the attractions of **Clacton** plus in the afternoon a spectacular free air show. Alternatively this year visit **Walton** or **Frinton** (see Sunday 6th June for full details)

BANK HOLIDAY MONDAY 30 AUGUST: SOUTHEND

Our traditional bank holiday trip to Southend. All the normal attractions plus the fascinating Pier museum (admission £1) will also be open for its summer season.

SUNDAY 5 SEPTEMBER: THE COTSWOLDS: BOURTON ON THE WATER

It is always a pretty ride through the Cotswolds. The day is centred on the pretty village of Bourton on the Water known as the Venice of the Cotswolds with its excellent range of attractions (Birdland; Dragonfly Maze; Model Village; Motor and Toy Museum; Model Railway; Indoor Adventure Play and Pottery); a large number of gift and specialist shops and a vast range of eating places.
